Back in 2001, Jim Klinko and other southern CA Alpine owners attended an ACA Homecoming Rally at Yakama Nation in Toppanish, WA. After discussions of starting chapters by geographic areas, Jim and others volunteered to start SoCal. A meeting was held and it was decided to basically divide California with Highway 58, based on the number of Alpine owners residing in CA at that time.

A rally was then planned for April 1, 2002 and was the First Official Alpine SoCal Rally. It was held at Pechanga, CA and became the first of many memorable SoCal rallies.

Fifteen years later, we are celebrating our success as the longest continuously running Alpine organization at the chapter level. We are especially proud that five of the original 13 members that joined in 2002 are still actively involved in our chapter. We are now 75 coaches strong, and looking forward to our anniversary rally in Chula Vista, March 31-April 3, 2017.

Something to Monitor:

At the Paso Robles Rally, my attention was called to a developing issue. The cross-frame bulkhead just ahead of the rear wheels will fatigue & crack over time and mileage. Sometime around (very) approximately 70,000 miles, the twisting of the frame while driving (and maybe while jacking the chassis to park) will begin fatiguing the bulkhead metal around the Huck bolts,

and the cracks begin at the lowest of 4ea Huck bolts visible inside that last compartment. For some that compartment has storage tanks on PS & Utility

Bay on D storage. A Stay tune That's Engin

Bay on DS, for others (38-40 footers) it is open for storage. We don't have a fix at this point. Stay tuned.



TRAVELING COLORADO'S STATE PARKS, and a few sites to see....Part 2 – Western Colorado

I hoped you enjoyed Part 1, the Eastern side of Colorado's Front Range as I will finish with Western Colorado, which actually became our favorite area. I hear the wonderful music of an Alpine diesel ready to go, so come along and find your favorite State Park too, (website is cpw.state.co.us).

Remember if you see this symbol it means a "travel tip" is next and this symbol is a place to visit. Our journey began our decent down, towards western Colorado with a night in Walden, aka "Never Summer" at a backyard with 3 beautiful, flat sites with full hook-ups called Granite RV, a really nice spot to camp. This area is very close to the Continental Divide as we trekked over Rabbit Ears Pass with more beautiful scenery of gorgeous rocks jutting out, flowers and meadows with the Steamboat Springs area as our destination. Stagecoach State Park is a wonderful park on the shores of the lake with trout and pike. This was one of our favorites. The other parks surrounding Steamboat Springs are Pearl Lake State Park and Steamboat Lake State Park.

Across the top of the state heading further west, outside of Craig we stayed at Yampa River State Park. The terrain here is flatter, more arid and wide-open filled with cattle ranches. The campground was again very nice and we took a free fly-fishing clinic put on by the Rangers at Elk Reservoir. Elkhead State Park is another park near the reservoir. In Craig is the Western History & Outlaw Museum. Along with a great history of the west and outlaws, they had a complete set of photos of every graduating class from the high school since it started in 1903!

Drove through Rangely along the White River to Meeker, a very quaint town. No state park campground but we really enjoyed a private one on the river, River Camp RV Park! We could walk out 5 feet and fish! Bring cash or check, no automated new-fangled credit card machine. Fun place to stay! Going south down the 'Western Slope' of the Rockies we went to Rifle Gap State Park, a newer campground at a reservoir and very nice with easy access. Just up the road is Rifle Falls State Park so we checked it out and did the simple hiked to Rifle Falls and Rifle Caves. Both were wonderful, the falls are three falls and the caves you can climb around inside.

I had to stop in Montrose because my dad was on the USS Montrose in WWII. There we took advantage of another very friendly Elks lodge to camp. A must is going to Black Canyons of the Gunnison National Park! Gorgeous, fantastic scenery everywhere you look. The Curecanti National Recreation area proved to be a



new, favorite area because of the park. At Morrow Point Reservoir for \$16 and 236 stairs down you can take an awesome boat ride through the canyon and see the National Park views looking up, oh and then take the 236 steps back up. The Museum of the Mountain West is a town of historical buildings from the 1880s-1930s along with the large museum of a reconstructed western storefront and offices. You felt as if you were right there! Next stop, Ridgeway State Park is a really nice park with a good central location for daily

drives. Drive 1: Ridgeway is a very cool, old west town with dirt streets and little shops. Drive

2: Ouray, the Switzerland of North America, a quaint town with many shops and beautiful mountains. A little more upscale than Ridgeway but still in keeping with the old west as the back streets are dirt! Also visit Box Cañon Falls, an earthquake fault with a massive waterfall cutting through. Drive 3: Silverton, gorgeous drive up the Red Mountain Pass at 11,000' to Silverton and the bonus over the train is you have time to wander the shops and sites. We agreed this was probably the most beautiful drive we've ever been on! We enjoyed a true Gold Mine Tour while there. It was pretty cool to go inside a real gold mine, feeling the intense dark, damp isolation.



This ends our travels circling Colorado and taking advantage of as many State Parks as we could get reservations! There are many, just plan further ahead because as I said, all of Colorado camps Friday and Saturday nights! I hope you've enjoyed this and I've given you some ideas for

travel. Reality is, wherever you go in an Alpine is wonderful, great traveling! Happy trails and enjoy life in Colorado from the AD period of Ancestral Pueblo people, to the wild, wild west and the wonderful National Parks and Monuments to visit!
